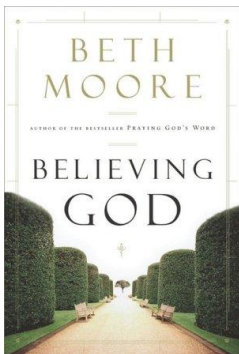

Believing God by Beth Moore

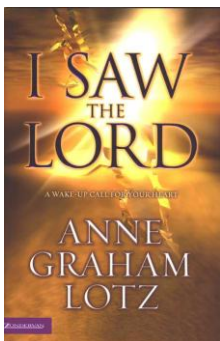
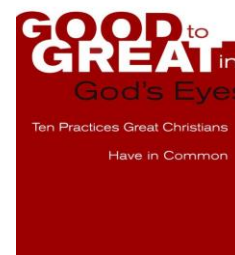

James - Mercy Triumphs

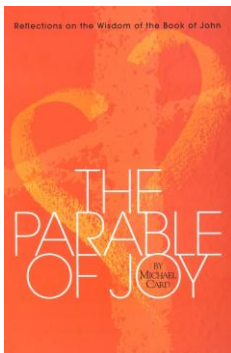

Parable of Joy: Reflections on the Wisdom of the Book of John

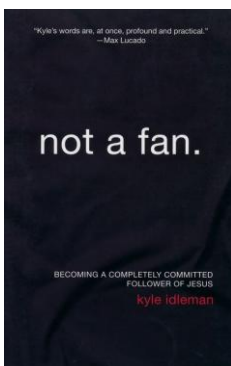
